Metropolitan College of New York Holds Relationship Workshop

Metropolitan College of New York, Bronx, NY - June 8, 2017 — Nearly 80 school counselors, social workers, and deans from schools across districts 7 to 12 gathered at the Metropolitan College of New York Thursday afternoon for a presentation hosted by The Relationship Foundation regarding ways in which to build healthy relationships with students.

Headed by Michael Jasz, the Founder and Executive Director of The Relationship Foundation, the presentation lasted approximately an hour and a half and involved interactive activities, time for questions, and subsequent interviews.

“Relationship education is the missing component in our educational system.” Jasz said before the presentation. “It’s core to the learning process.”

The Healthy Relationships 101 curriculum can be tailored to any class structure, whether it be in-class instruction, assemblies, parent and teacher workshops, or professional development.

The Relationship Foundation, whose office is located in the East Village of New York City, implements relationship education into schools and organizations in New York City and nationwide. The organization teaches the fundamentals of Nonviolent Communication, empowering individuals to articulate their needs and feelings without blame and judgment, and listening empathically.

Founded in 2008, the Foundation has a book titled, “Healthy Relationships 101”, which provides students with a communication skill set that empowers them to express confidence, leadership, and empathy in all of their relationships. It has been introduced into schools throughout New York City and the United States, as well as Canada and Europe.
