Relationship Education Presented to Alternative Learning Center Teachers

New York City Department of Education, Bronx, NY - May 12, 2017 — Nearly 50 teachers from eight Alternative Learning Center schools in the Bronx gathered at New York City's Department of Education Friday afternoon for a presentation on how to build healthy relationships with students, hosted by The Relationship Foundation.

Marla Aviles-Lopez, an Assistant Principal and Education Management Professional at the NYC Department of Education, said "the presenters were knowledgeable and gave practical examples. [What served me most] was the interactive, hands-on conversation to practice empathy."

Josette Smith, a school counselor at the NYC Department of Education, said the presentation was "very informative on a social and personal level as well as on a clinical level."

Headed by Michael Jasz, the Founder and Executive Director of The Relationship Foundation, the presentation lasted approximately two hours and involved interactive activities, time for questions, and subsequent interviews.

“Relationship education is the missing component in our educational system.” Jasz said before the presentation. “It’s core to the learning process.”

The Healthy Relationships 101 curriculum can be tailored to any class structure, whether it be in-class instruction, assemblies, parent and teacher workshops, or professional development.

The Relationship Foundation, headquartered in New York City, implements relationship education into schools and organizations nationwide. The organization teaches the fundamentals of Nonviolent Communication, empowering individuals to articulate their needs and feelings without blame and judgment and to listen empathically.

Founded in 2008, the Foundation’s book titled, “Healthy Relationships 101,” provides a communication skill set that can empower anyone to express confidence, leadership, and empathy in all of their relationships. It has been introduced into schools throughout New York City and the United States.
